The Department of Paediatric and Child Health and University of Cape Town invite applications for a part-time (2 hours a week) Paediatrics clinical teaching post based at Red Cross Children's Hospital. This 1-year contract will begin in February 2018.

Requirements:

- Qualified Paediatrician registered with HPCSA
- At least 3 years' experience as a paediatric clinician
- Previous (at least 3 years) experience teaching

Responsibilities:

- The applicant will be required to primarily teach weekly 2-hour bed-side clinical tutorials for sixth year medical students (PED6000W Paediatrics and Child Health block). Teaching will take place in the general paediatrics ward of Red Cross Children's Hospital. When required the applicant may need to instead teach other undergraduate students completing their paediatrics rotation.
- The applicant will be required to participate as a clinical examiner when needed in the end-of-block examinations.

The remuneration for this position will be based on the qualification and paid on the clinical payroll.
