- A research track record, evidenced by peer-reviewed journal publications.

Responsibilities:

- Teaching psychological assessment in the MA in Clinical Psychology.
- Teaching, as assigned, throughout undergraduate and Honours years.
- Clinical supervision of trainees in the MA in Clinical Psychology.
- Convene at least one course (usually an undergraduate course).
- Conduct and publish research.
- Contribute to departmental, faculty and university administration.
