We wish to appoint an applicant with proven academic potential and an interest in teaching public law courses at the LLB level. Core LLB courses offered by the Department include Constitutional law; Administrative Law; International Law; Criminal Law; Criminal Procedure and Evidence. As the successful candidate, you will be expected to play a full part in teaching, research and supervision at the LLB level. Depending on your qualifications and experience, you may have the opportunity to teach at LLM level. You will also be expected to fulfil the administrative functions typically associated with the level at which you are appointed. A willingness to undertake socially responsive activities is also required.

For the first two years of service at UCT the successful candidate will enjoy the benefits of the Department of Higher Education and Training's New Generation of Academics Programme (nGAP). This will include:

- Access to some dedicated Research and Conference Funding;
- Participation in nGAP activities including regular meetings and writing retreats;
- A slightly reduced lecturing load in support of doctoral research.

Minimum requirements for the post include:

- A master's degree specialising in public law (with a pass of 70% or higher); Demonstrated high academic ability and evidence of an ability to undertake original academic research and to publish it.
- Registration for or clear intention to register for a PhD.

Lecturing or other appropriate work experience will be an advantage.

In terms of the nGAP conditions, we seek to attract applicants **younger than 40 years**.
