The Department of Public Law, within the Faculty of Law, invites applications for an academic appointment to the level of Senior Lecturer / Associate Professor / Professor post specializing in **criminology** to commence employment as soon as possible.

We wish to appoint an applicant with an excellent academic record, with the qualities for academic leadership and who wishes to be part of a faculty in which a critical approach to the study of criminology is valued. As the successful candidate, you will be expected to play a full part in teaching, research, and supervision in criminology at both the LLB and postgraduate (PhD/LLM/MPhil) levels. You will also be expected to fulfil the administrative functions typically associated with the level at which you are appointed. A willingness to undertake socially responsive activities is also required. The successful candidate will be located in the **Centre of Criminology** (www.criminology.uct.ac.za).

Candidates suitable for appointment as a Senior Lecturer must have:

- At least a Master's degree specialising in criminology, but a doctoral degree or equivalent level of scholarship will be an advantage
- Lecturing experience in criminology and/or other appropriate work experience
- Evidence of ability to effectively supervise academic research, including postgraduate research; and
- An established research record with publications in criminology.

Candidates suitable for appointment as an Associate Professor must have:

- A doctoral degree or equivalent level of scholarship specialising in criminology
- Lecturing experience in criminology
- Demonstrable capacity to supervise at a postgraduate level and
- A strong and consistent record of publications in criminology appropriate to the level of Associate Professor
- Evidence of administrative experience; and
- Track record of socially responsive activities, public and professional service.

Candidates suitable for appointment as Professor must have:

- A doctoral degree or equivalent level of scholarship specialising in criminology
- Extensive lecturing experience in criminology
- An established record of postgraduate supervision
- A strong and consistent record of publications in criminology appropriate to the level of Professor
- Evidence of academic leadership; and
- Strong track record of socially responsive activities, public and professional service.

Responsibilities:

- Teaching undergraduate and postgraduate courses offered by the Department of Public Law in criminology as required by the Department, including courses offered outside of the Faculty of Law.
- Supervising a cohort of Master's and doctoral students (as appropriate to the level of appointment)
- Maintaining a research profile and publication output commensurate for level of appointment.
- Providing academic leadership and service in the Centre of criminology and in the Department of Public Law (relating to criminology), including curriculum development, appropriate to the level of appointment.
- Contributing to university, faculty and departmental activities and administrative responsibilities appropriate to the level of appointment.
