Adult Primary Care (APC) – IMPLEMENTATION AND TRAINING FACILITATORS

The Knowledge Translation Unit (www.knowledgetranslation.co.za), based at the University of Cape Town Lung Institute (www.lunginstitute.co.za) in Mowbray, is looking for an Implementation and Training Facilitator* for each of the following Eastern Cape Province Districts: Amatole, OR Tambo and Chris Hani.

Unit Description

The Knowledge Translation Unit (KTU) whose work is focused on implementing government policy in health systems and researching its programmes' effectiveness. Adult Primary Care (APC), formerly known as Primary Care 101 (PC 101) is tailored to reflect National Department of Health guidelines and policies. The KTU is currently working in the Eastern Cape Province, alongside the Provincial Department of Health Regional Training Centre, to embed APC into the health system in Amatole, Chris Hani and OR Tambo Districts.

Requirements include:

- Registration with the South African Nursing Council (SANC) as Professional Nurse (R425) or equivalent qualification that allows registration with SANC.
- Primary Care 101 or PACK or Adult Primary Care Master Trainer
- Post-registration [postgraduate] nursing qualification with a duration of at least 1 year accredited with SANC in the following: Diploma in Clinical Nursing Science: Health, Assessment, Treatment and Care registered with the SANC [R48] is recommended.
- Experience as a NIMART mentor is recommended.
- A qualification in nursing education is recommended.
- A minimum of 2-3 years' experience in working in primary health care.
- A minimum of 2-3 years' experience in training programme development, facilitation and implementation.
- Computer Literacy (proficiency in MS Office - Word, PowerPoint, Excel and Outlook).
- Valid driver's license.

In addition, the applicant should have most of these attributes:

- A mature and responsible attitude towards work, with the ability to take ownership of projects
- Good communication and organisational skills
- Strong on giving attention to detail
- Take the initiative and solve problems
- Work well under pressure
- Be adaptable to new projects and requirements
- The ability to work independently and also be a team player; with a willingness to take direction.

Responsibilities will include:

- Supporting co-ordination of training in Primary Health Care settings
- Managing and supporting district implementation of Adult Primary Care (APC)
- Training Facility Trainers in Adult Primary Care
- Mentoring APC Master Trainers and Facility Trainers
- Signing off Portfolio of Evidence (POE) for certification of nurses as authorized prescribers
- Programme/curriculum and materials development in collaboration with head of training, co-trainers and guide developers

The applicants will be based in either Amatole, Chris Hani or OR Tambo Districts, but will also be required to travel provincially and nationally. The salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications.
